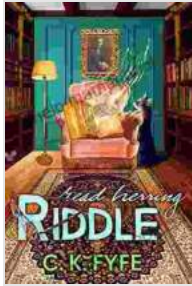

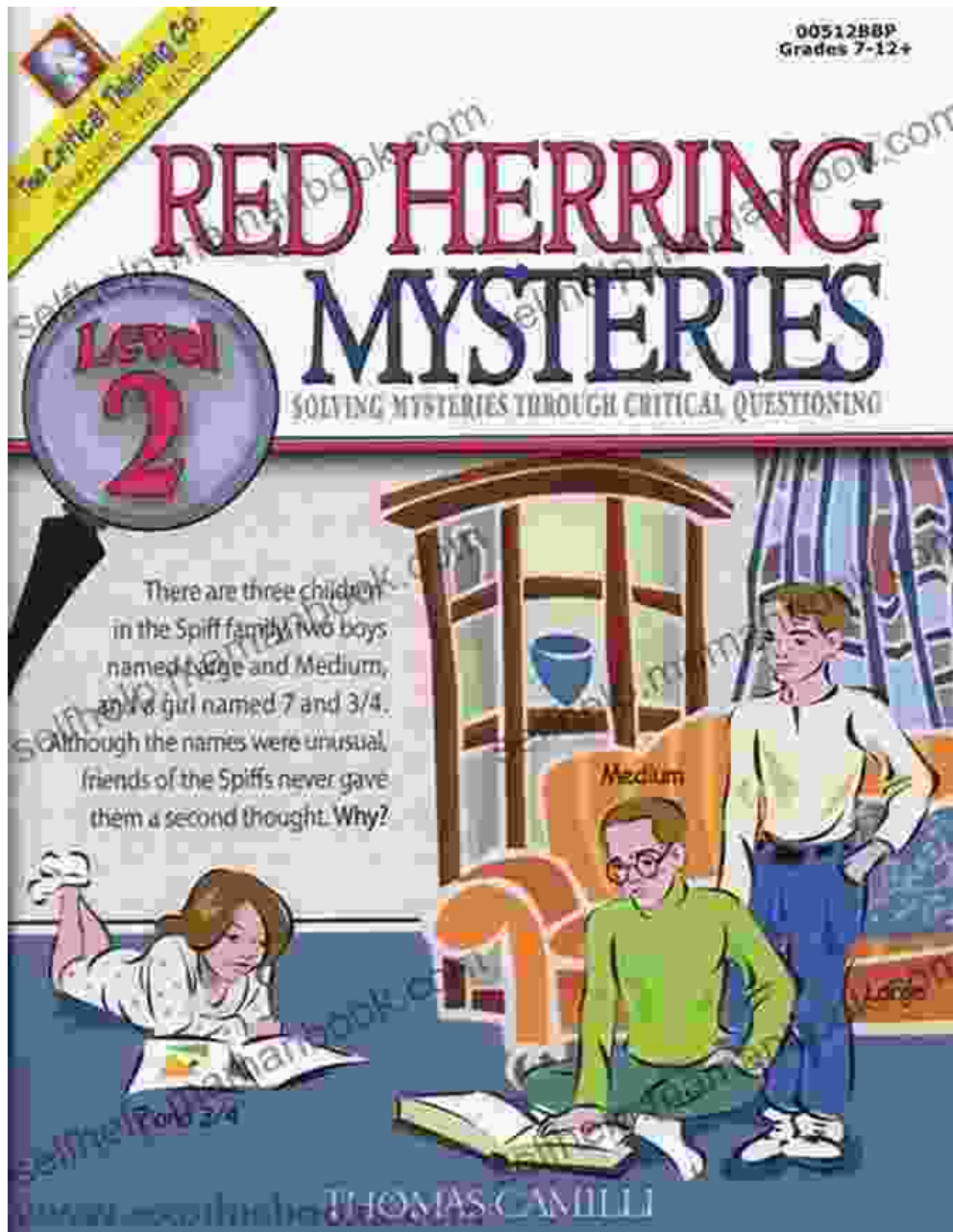

Macy confronted Mr. James with her evidence. He confessed to the crime and was arrested.

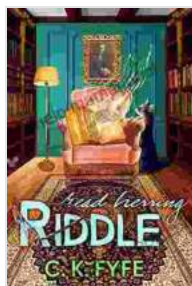

Macy never forgot Mrs. Carter. She often visited her grave and told her about the cases that she had solved.

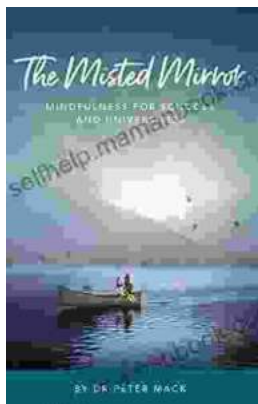

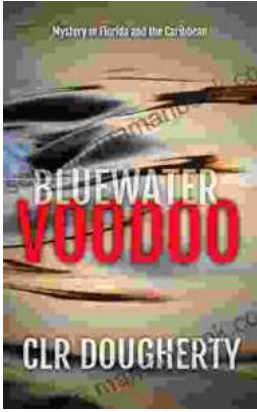
