- 5. Finish off, leaving a long tail for attaching the head to the body.

Flippers:

- 1. With green yarn, make 4 chains and join with a slip stitch to form a ring.
- 2. Round 1: Increase in each stitch around (8 sc). Round 2: *Sc in the next 2 stitches, increase in the next stitch. Repeat from * around (12 sc).
- 3. Rounds 3-6: Sc in each stitch around.
- 4. Change to blue yarn and work 2 rounds of sc in each stitch. Finish off and weave in ends.

Tail:

- 1. With green yarn, make 4 chains and join with a slip stitch to form a ring.
- 2. Round 1: Increase in each stitch around (8 sc). Rounds 2-3: Sc in each stitch around.
- 3. Finish off and weave in ends.

Assembly:

- 1. Sew the flippers to either side of the body.
- 2. Attach the tail to the back of the body.
- 3. Sew on the safety eyes.
- 4. Stuff the head and body with fiberfill.
- 5. With white yarn, embroider the mouth and nostrils.

Expert Tips:

- Use different shades of green to create a more realistic-looking turtle.
- Vary the size of the safety eyes for a more expressive turtle.
- Add a keychain ring to the turtle's back to turn it into a charming accessory.
- Create a matching sea turtle family by crocheting turtles in different sizes.


